INPO Update



INPO has developed Station Viewer, an interactive dashboard that collates several important data elements to provide an easy-to-see snapshot of key station performance indicators. Based on a series of successful pilots, INPO plans has released Station Viewer in the first two weeks of June for all our U.S. industry members.

Although previously it has been an internally used INPO tool, late last year, a project team began working to make Station Viewer available externally to our industry members. Now, designated site and corporate leaders will be provided access to Station Viewer via the INPO Member Website, based on an allocation of licenses for each station and corporation.

INPO launched the beta version of Station Viewer with Wolf Creek and Xcel Energy in late April and began piloting in May with DTE's Fermi, and the stations belonging to NextEra, Constellation Energy, and Duke Energy.

"We had originally planned to roll out Station Viewer by the end of June, but the team is pleased to announce that Station Viewer will be ready for full use by our U.S. industry members a few weeks early," said Angie Hensley, manager of INPO Special Projects.

"One key benefit of Station Viewer is that it will improve collaboration between INPO and the industry. By more quickly recognizing declines, we can work together to close gaps," said Donna Jacobs, INPO Vice President of Data & Analytics.
